"I have done numerous photo tours with various professionals over the years and what I'm about to say may sound like it came from the Jim Cline Marketing department but it isn't. My wife, Jan, and I did a tour of Peru with Jim earlier in the year. This was our first tour with him. I can say without equivocation that he is the best photo tour leader I have ever had and would not hesitate to do another tour with him. In fact my wife and I signed up to go on his Vietnam tour (with Cambodia extension) in February of 2012. The fact that a large number of his participants are repeats speaks to this. So, you ask – what is it about Jim that rates him above others. Well:

- 1. For starters, he is priced very competitively, especially with what he offers (evening dinners were included in the tour price not a small thing, logistically and money-wise)
- 2. His groups are kept small and manageable. 8-12 people vs. 18 for example
- 3. Even though we had a small group, he had a large bus (larger than needed) for our trips around and between locations. Leg room and overhead storage become pretty important, especially on the longer segments of the trips.
- 4. He has always thoroughly scouted the locations he takes you to. The locals often know him by name and often run up to meet him when he arrives. In Pisac, Peru, for example, my wife and I got to meet his Godson, the son of a family that lives far up on the mountain above some ruins. And they had to trek down the mountain to meet us and then back up to tend their herds at the end of the day. AND they wanted him to be Godfather to a brand new baby we got to meet.
- 5. One thing that endears him to the locals is that on each trip he promises to bring back photos of them when he returns. And he does. They flock around him and get real excited when they see the prints he made back in the States.
- 6. He hires local guides when appropriate and all the ones on our trip were ones he had used before and they were all pretty good.
- 7. A lot of the best shots of the trip were serendipitous. He won't hesitate to stop the bus if he sees something worth shooting. We were driving along between locations one day and we saw a shriveled old guy herding his goats across a field with a snow covered mountain in the background. STOP the BUS!. We get off and go out into the field and we all got some really good shots. He also doesn't rush you along, yet somehow manages to keep on schedule.
- 8. You are guaranteed lots of close up and intimate portrait shots of locals. He often grabs an interesting looking local off the streets and convinces (bribes?) them to pose as a model for the group.

- 9. He is actually a good photo instructor. He will give you as much or as little attention as you want.
- 10. Not the least of all, he is laid back and very likeable.
